COCA is pleased to announce the selections for the 2009-2010 COCA Family Theatre Series: eight acclaimed productions from October 2009 through March 2010. The Series is a much-loved St. Louis institution, with world-class theatre, music, and dance presented in an intimate setting. Families may choose subscription packages containing five performances of their choice, or all eight performances.

This season's lineup boasts Grammy and Emmy Award-winners, and a Tony Award nominee, and continues the tradition of having a strong literary component. The Series includes audience favorites from previous years as well as several new and innovative performances from southwest Louisiana to London.

THE SEASON:

Laura Ingalls Wilder, October 2-4, 2009

This fascinating story about one of America's most beloved authors comes to life in an uplifting musical from New Jersey-based ArtsPower. Through serious obstacles, their pioneering spirit and family bonds are never broken.
