LOOSE THREADS BY DOUGLAS DALE OPENS JANUARY 26 IN THE MILLSTONE GALLERY AT COCA

ST. LOUIS (January 23, 2024)—*Loose Threads*, an exhibition by Douglas Dale, opens in the <u>Millstone Gallery</u> at COCA on Friday, January 26 at 6:00 p.m. With their distinctive use of yarn glued to wood, Dale creates domestic and imagined landscapes made by carefully contouring surfaces line by line. *Loose Threads* runs January 26–April 7, 2024.

WHAT: Loose Threads by Douglas Dale A single thread out of place can distort the illusion of perfect embroidery or reduce the perception of the quality of a smooth hand of fabric. Its free movement against the whole piece becomes a threat (the threatening thread) to strict notions of perfection and unity. Douglas Dale offers us several loose threads in this collection of their latest work. Each of their sculptures and shadowboxes contains the spectrum between rigidity and looseness as an invitation to reflect on other polarities enforced by society: roughness and tenderness, normativity and gueerness, masculine and feminine. The exhibition's interactive wall encourages visitors to create their own fabric sculptures by collaboratively covering domestic objects with yarn. Either sharing objects usually found in the intimacy of their houses or following the vulnerable act of repetition while creating patterns and stitches, this art-making experience challenges participants to disrupt given structures and craft a unique multiple version of themselves.
