

COCA is at the intersection of Trinity Avenue and Washington Avenue, one block south of Delmar Blvd.

Free parking for all COCA camp families and visitors is available in the shared COCA/Washington University garage located across from COCA on Washington Avenue. The arms at the entrance and exit work on a sensor to keep a count of the cars in the garage. You do not need to pull a ticket, nor will you be charged to exit.



Drop-off and Pick-up for Campers Ages 3 to 7

Those dropping off and picking up campers ages 3 to 7 should park in the garage and escort their campers directly to/from their classroom. Individuals authorized to pick up campers must be submitted in advance and listed in camper's online account or as an emergency contact.

You are permitted to turn right onto Washington Avenue in order to enter the parking garage. When leaving, you may use Trinity Avenue as an exit only.

Camp Pick-up: Use Kingsland southbound to Washington Avenue westbound to access the parking garage. We have included a map for your reference.

Drop-off and Pick-up for Campers Ages 8 & Up

Campers ages 8+ should be dropped off and picked up in the circle drive in front of COCA's main entrance (on Edward Jones Drive). Do not turn onto Washington Avenue from Kingsland. We have included a map for your reference. Follow the key for 8 & Up. Remain straight on Kingsland and pass COCA.

Turn right at the Kingsbury Boulevard intersection (driving behind COCA)
Turn right on to Trinity Avenue (the next intersection)

Turn right onto Washington Avenue at COCA and enter our circle drive where your camper will be dropped off

You will exit via Kingsland (the way you came in)





LUNCH/SNACK Full-Day Campers: Whether attending one full-day camp, or two half-day camps, students should bring a sack lunch, drink, and two snacks. A supervised lunch will take place on campus between camps.

Half-Day Campers: Bring a drink and one snack.

COCA camps have a nut-free policy. All snacks and lunches must be entirely nut free.

Weather permitting, COCA will have an outdoor space available for lunches. Allergy-free lunch table available. Soda/juice machines and water bottle filling stations available. Refrigerator and microwave NOT provided.

INCLUSION SERVICES COCA has highly experienced teaching artists on staff who lead group instruction for 10-35 campers each day. COCA's teaching artists are prepared to make accommodations within their instruction to timing, directions, physical activity level, and/or complexity to help students succeed.

Parents/Guardians are asked to notify COCA during the online registration process or by contacting the registration office at registration@cocastl.org or 314.561.4898 to request accommodations. COCA staff will follow up on all requests to craft the best plan of action and arrange for reasonable modifications or services necessary. Notification of needed services is key to create a positive experience for all campers.

Campers who require the one-on-one support of an assigned aide or para may bring their own support person, provided that person passes a criminal background check.

Individuals authorized to pick up campers must be submitted in advance and listed in camper's online account or as an emergency contact. **Due to limited capacity, early registration is encouraged.**

PAYMENT PLANS: A 20% down payment, \$30 annual registration fee (if not already active for the camper), and \$15 payment plan set-up fee are required upon registration. Your credit card or checking account will automatically be billed in equal payments according to the schedule below. For registrations after March 1, previous payment plan installments also will be due at the time of registration. All registrations after April 30 must be paid in full at time of registration. All payment plan registrations must be paid in full by June 1.

FINANCIAL OBLIGATION: COCA does offer payment plan opportunities. COCA reserves the right to suspend or terminate instruction and performance participation for students who do not meet their financial obligations. Students are liable for the full cost of tuition. Students with outstanding balances will NOT be allowed to re-register until the balance is paid in full.

RETURNED PAYMENT POLICY: It is COCA's policy to charge a \$25 processing fee for any returned payments (checks or credit cards). Those whose payments are returned may lose the privilege to pay via check, credit card and payment plan.

SLIDING SCALE TUITION

COCA offers a sliding scale tuition program for qualifying students.

WITHDRAWALS/REFUNDS: Tuition and before/after care fees will be refunded, less a \$25 processing fee per camp, if you submit a withdrawal form by these deadlines:

COCA offers no refund or credit for missed camp days due to illness, schedule conflicts or any other reasons. Registration fees are nonrefundable.

MEDICAL WITHDRAWALS: COCA offers no refund or credit after the withdrawal deadline except for documented medical conditions. You must submit a withdrawal form and documentation on physician's letterhead. Medical withdrawals must be submitted before the last day of your child's camp. Tuition will be refunded less the \$25 processing fee per camp.

TRANSFERS: COCA offers the opportunity for students to transfer to another camp if space is available. Transfer forms are available in the front lobby and the Registration Office. Transfers must be submitted **before** the start of your child's camp.

CANCELLATION: In the event that enrollment does not reach the required number for a particular camp, or circumstances arise beyond COCA's control, COCA reserves the right to cancel. You will be notified, and we will be happy to work with you to find a suitable replacement. If no replacement can be settled upon, COCA will refund your money in full, less your non-refundable registration fee.

RELEASE/WAIVER: I hereby agree to indemnify and hold harmless COCA and its employees from and against any and all claims for personal injuries or damages of any kind arising from participation in the COCA program.
